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### History

A new born baby girl was consulted for a birthmark noted at birth. The baby was born full term by normal spontaneous delivery. The prenatal history was unremarkable. The left sided abdominal wall was noted to have a violaceous patch at birth, blanchable and no palpable mass lesion underlying (Figure 1). Otherwise the baby was healthy and physical examination revealed no other abnormality, in particular cardiovascular and abdominal examination was normal.
